Evening Visits and Letters.

The days planned for evening visits were fraught with trips to Camelford and St Austell as both the water pump and boiler decided to have problems at the same time. The water pump had done eight and a half years faithful service, with one repair, and finally said it had had enough. Thank you very much Aaron and Alexander McCloud for ordering and fitting the new pump. However nothing is straightforward; when Alexander ordered the pump, Pauline paid with her debit card, so consequently the firm, in their wisdom, sent the part to K&P's postal address in Hayle!!!!. Keith then had an extra exciting trip to Hayle to fetch the pump.

The problem on the boiler required two trips to St Austell. The first trip to find the part; the second fit it. K&P literally had to wait in the cold for the part as there was no heating or hot water until the problem was fixed!!! The time all this occurred was during the week designated for evening visits.

God was so faithful, during that week as all the van repairs and the evening visits were accomplished. Pauline was able to go out with Keith the first evening, Shirley came the second and Pat and Keith completed the evening visits on the Thursday. During the three evenings 23 Bibles were given to people who otherwise would not have received if the team did not go out in the evenings.

The following Monday, Sylvia, Pat, Jonathan and Keith headed out with only 30 letters (i.e. people who were not contacted after three visits) out of 300 properties. Usually during the letter visits there are very few people at home, but this time was different. Sylvia and Pat found two people at home, and Jonathan and Keith found quite a few people at the addresses they visited.

The village of St Teath is now FINISHED with 73% of the 313 properties receiving Bibles and tracts or both.



Sundays

The last Sunday in February K&P with Pat went to a morning service at the Residential Home in Tintagel. The owner of the home holds a weekly service for the residents. Pauline led some of the worship with her guitar and Keith shared his testimony, encouraging the residents who didn't know Jesus to come to Him. It was wonderful to see how many there already knew Jesus, while others were willing to receive prayer. K&P were also able to pray with one lady who was not well enough to come along to the meeting.



On the Streets

Last month's open air service organised by Gavin and Linda was a follow on to Bible distribution; the forecast was very cold and dreadful for the last Sunday in February. Despite this, twelve people gathered on Treligga Downs Rd ready to share the good news of Jesus in Delabole. There was a time of praying, singing and Gavin preached on the parable of the wheat and tares. The Lord was very gracious as the weather was sunny, dry and the position they met in was sheltered from the wind.

As God has put on Gavin and Linda's heart to do an open air outreach after bible distribution, He has shown Pat something different. She has booked the Poldark Inn for Easter Saturday afternoon, where she and a team of helpers have invited the people who have made an initial commitment to Jesus people for tea and hot cross buns. There will be Christians from the different fellowships there and it will be an opportunity to build relationships with these people who have just met Jesus.



World Women's Day of Prayer

Pauline was invited to speak at the World Women's Day of Prayer in Camelford. She was challenged by the topic the ladies from Cameroon chose which was Praise. When considering the difficulties of living in the third world one would think the choice would be either suffering or disaster or some similarly related topic, but they chose praise. Pauline felt this was a lesson in itself, that despite all, we should Praise the Lord.



Micah Prayer Day

The people gathered for the last time at St Teath Methodist Chapel. It was good to have David Kessel, Viv and Jill Champion. The people prayed for *Micah* and the events which the local Christians have planned as a follow up to Bible distribution. The Holy Spirit was graciously present from the beginning. There was a tongue, and three people had an interpretation, which fitted together perfectly. It was an encouragement from the Lord to do the things He has planned. Pauline shared some thoughts she had from Isaiah 44:21 - 23. In these verses the Lord declares:-

*Remember -
what I have done for you.
You are a servant.
You are created by me.
I will not forget you.
I have redeemed you
to praise.
It is My glory which needs to
be displayed.*

Pauline and Linda have been sharing through Isaiah during lent, taking a different chapter each day, and these thoughts came out of Pauline's Lenten Musings: no doubt Peppy will be after the full 40 day diary at the end of Lent!!! ("YOU BET" Says Peppy!!!) The day continued with Jill sharing a picture concerning people worshipping in their own homes different 'false idols', which was prayed into. Keith shared a prophetic word which was very much to do with being ready to continue the work where *Micah* left off. The word was about an exit strategy, and Pauline was reminded of the Iraq war. The troops went in quickly and 'won' the war, but we are still trying to leave in a suitable way. It's great to see the way the Lord has called folks in St Teath, to continue to reach out to the people who have made an initial commitment to Jesus. There was a time when the 6 folks who do not live in St Teath prayed with the 6 who do. The day finished with the proclamation over St Teath from Isaiah 60.



Down on the Farm

While K&P were living in Yorkshire, Keith helped with the harvest at Ivan and Heather's arable farm, for a number of years. While staying at Paul and Doreen Oven's farm, Paul asked K&P if they would keep an eye on the farm while they were away racing in Bath. This they had done in the past, by putting the dogs dinner out, letting the chickens out in the morning, and closing them up at night. K&P readily said yes, only to later realise that Paul had a number of ewes which could have lambed and a cow which could have calved. When Pauline asked Paul what to do if any of the ewes were in distress, she meant what was the vet's phone number; not to receive instructions of pulling out legs or pushing back heads!!!! All went well, however; none of the ewes lambed, and the cow managed to calve all by herself, with K&P arriving just as she was cleaning the calf off. It was a delight to watch as the little one tried to rise to its feet. The 'stand in' carers were thrilled to see Paul and Doreen arrive home, and equally thrilled to know that Paul completed the race. They read on Face Book that Paul was raising money for a Water Buffalo; K&P are hoping it is not going to arrive on the farm before they leave!!!

Back to Delabole



The second Monday in March saw the team back in Delabole to begin offering Bibles to the final 120 homes in the village. During the first two days around 30 homes, and one passing man, received Bibles. This is the last part of the mandate that the Lord gave K&P before they came to Cornwall, and when this is completed they believe the Lord will show them a strategy for offering a Bible to every home in Cornwall. K&P are seeing what the Lord is doing already, and will be sharing more after the Trustees' weekend.



A Week of Visits

K&P have visited a number of people with a view to sharing where they believe the Lord is taking the ministry in the near future. They began by visiting Rev Steve Wild, who is the Methodist Chairman of the District for Cornwall. Steve and the Bishop of Truro are going to be involved in outreach in St Austell over the Easter Week. They are working both inside buildings, and out on the streets.

K&P also visited Mrs. Wendy Cashmore in East Taphouse. Wendy has a heart to see door to door evangelism in her village: K&P will be in touch with her in September to discuss dates. Finally Rev Ray Avent, from the Methodist chapel in Camelford asked to meet up with K&P to discuss the possibility of Micah MM being involved with Bible Distribution in Camelford at a later date. It seems that as the mandate the Lord gave K&P, to evangelise in St Just, Hayle and St Teath, draws to a close, He is opening a way for fulfilling the vision to offer a Bible to every home in Cornwall. K&P will be sharing this at the Trustees' weekend, and together they will be seeking the Lord for His plans to see the vision completed. K&P believe the Lord would have them give themselves to the work, with renewed zeal, for the next ten years, in which time they believe the Lord will put in place that which is necessary to see the vision completed by themselves and others who He will enroll.



Youth Work????

Keith was invited to share with the youth from the Church in the House, and so he put on his trendy gear ("ho-ho" says P), let down what hair he has and set off to preach what he believed the Lord had to say. The first week Keith shared how the Lord opened his eyes to Jesus, and began to strip away the things which needed to change in Keith's life. The second week Keith talked about the need to be constantly filled with the Holy Spirit, come daily to the cross of Jesus, die to the things that do not please Jesus, and to get into God's word, not as a daily chore, but as life giving food which in so needed. Keith challenged them to read through the Bible, and to get God's word into their hearts. It was a privilege and a challenge to Keith to share with the young people, and he prays that it will have a lasting effect in their lives.



A Visit to Tremore

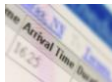

It was inspirational to see this man of God, who for 40 years carried the cross around the world visiting every country, sharing the love of Jesus. Keith was so touched by the film that he left, not speaking to anyone, and went home to think about what he had seen. Pauline was challenged by the obedience to God's command shown in Arthur's life and his openness to God's will. It is a film worth watching when it is produced in European format.

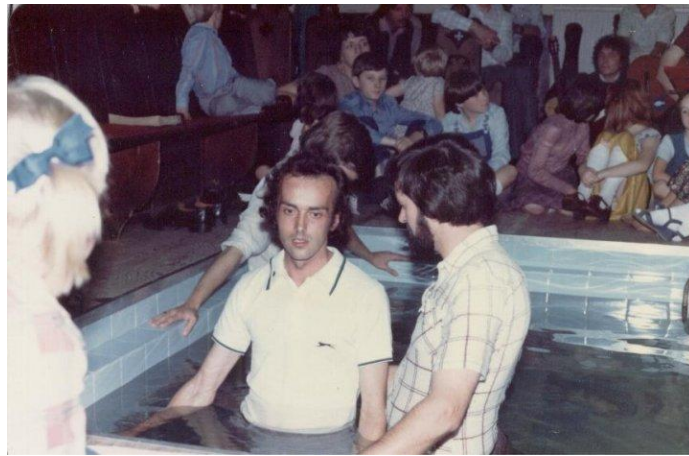
Praise and Thanksgiving

This Word was given to Keith on the 26th February 2010;
the night before the Chilean earthquake.

“The room will suddenly shake as people pray. Prayer is powerful and active and I am activating My people to fervent prayer and calling My prayer warriors to pray for a mighty moving and shaking of the nations. You will suddenly hear of earthquakes and rumbling noises within the earth as these will take place before I come”, says the Lord. “I am coming for My Church and just as suddenly as the room shakes, the earth quakes and so I will return SUDDENLY. I am preparing My people and My church, that they might be at one with one another so that they can prepare themselves for My coming. My Word is spreading around the world at this time. Many things are suddenly happening in the world today which is showing that the coming of the Lord is soon; there are things being put into place. Satan is getting more and more agitated as the Word of God is going out; you can already see the things that are happening within the spiritual realm, the world, the government and the governmental bodies today. Things suddenly appear on your computer screens that cause you think <“what does it say in the Word of God”>; for now is the time for my children to awake and to arise and to go out to proclaim my Word, in season and out of season. There will suddenly be people from all over the world who will come to my cross because my Word does not return void. You will suddenly see salvation like you have never seen it before. For I am turning the heat up and you will hear rumours of more wars and earthquakes and the things that will happen on this planet will cause you to pray fervently. I am calling My prayer warriors all over this county and indeed the world, all to draw together to pray and to be steadfast in love and unity together. For now is the time and this is the hour that you are placed in. This time is the last hour for My church to get up, arise and go forward”, says the Lord. “For there will be many more suddenly’s to cause people to rethink and reprogramme their schedules. I am getting ready to come. Are you ready to receive me?”
