New Year; New Thoughts

With the New Year, K&P believe the Lord will say new things, both for them personally and for *M.M.M.*

During the half night of prayer in December the Lord gave a prophetic word (see the last page). K&P were reminded of the importance of testing the word then praying 'through' and 'in' the things God is saying. The Lord seems to be stressing the importance of working as one in sharing the Kingdom of God. There is also a sense that the Lord is going to move in salvation in the near future. God spoke to Pauline with two succinct phrases **1. To Know HIM; 2. To Share HIM.** Again the Lord emphasised how vital it is that we have a relationship with Him; all we do should stem from that and not just from a sense of duty. The relationship should cause us to be so full of HIM that we cannot but help to share HIM. The scripture the Lord gave through Keith is **2 Corinthians 6:1-2. As God's co-workers we urge you not to receive God's grace in vain. For He says, "In the time of my favour I heard you, and in the day of salvation I helped you. I tell you, now is the time of God's favour, and now is the day of salvation."**

Paul in another scripture urges us to work while it is day, because the night is coming when no one will work. As things darken in the nation, let us not be found weeping and wailing when our freedom has gone.

Pauline got up at her usual time and looked out of the window, only to see winter wonderland. She put on Radio Cornwall to hear that North Cornwall was under several cms of snow. The meeting with Phil was cancelled; K&P decided to spend the time with Jesus. This was the beginning of several days of snow that kept K&P from their usual pursuits meaning that even more time was spent seeking the Lord and hearing from Him.

What does one do in a van when it snows? K&P do thank all those who expressed their concern for them during this time, but they praise the Lord that they had ample water supply from the Kroliks and Mc Clouds (the water on the farm was frozen). K&P were able to get in a spare bottle of calor gas thanks to a spare

bottle Paul found on the farm. Linda kindly did a load of washing when the launderette at Wadebridge was out of reach. Shopping was achieved on the days when the roads were clear.

The service K&P were taking at Bosinney on the 10th of January was cancelled; however K&P were delighted to join Paul, Doreen, Arthur and Janet at the farmhouse for a time of praising, praying and sharing. The Lord had been speaking to K&P about some of the DVD's they were watching, and He informed that the things they were watching were not building them up, not Pauline adds that there were any above a 12 rating, but just that they were not going to build them in the Lord. K&P culled their collection, and were encouraged when Pat lent them some of her DVD's which they received just before the snow came. So with water, warmth, food, DVD's and clean clothes they have so far weathered the winter weather.



The Prayer Team

You may wonder why if Keith and the team go out on the doors at 10am, do the team meet at 9am? The answer is that they meet to praise and pray before going out. Pauline would like to share with you just one of these mornings. On Monday January 18th, they began with the singing of Godfrey Birtill's song 'Just as He Said', one of which verses speaks of Jesus being the bread of life. Maureen, who was leading the prayer time, asked the team to read together John 6:24-48. She encouraged the team with the thought that Jesus, who is the bread of life, is the one the people in St Teath need, and as we take the Bible, the word of God, we will pray that the people will also receive Jesus who is the living Word of God.

Pauline W shared about a book she had been reading, Selected to Live, in which the writer had come to know Jesus through reading a Children's Bible. The team continued to pray about Jesus being the word of God, and praying that people in St Teath who had received Bibles would begin to read them. Pat shared something she had encountered at the weekend. A lady was sharing with her that during the snowy period when she could not get out to the shops she ran out of sugar. She was really in need of some sugar in her drink, and so she searched through the 20 handbags she had to see if there were any little packets of sugar in them. She found enough to fill her sugar bowl! Pat said the Lord had shown her that many people in the area now had Bibles and that in a time of need they could search through and find Jesus, who would be all that they needed. Keith shared a picture that he had of a gleaming Rolls Royce. It looked good, but it would not go anywhere because it had no engine. The Lord showed him to put a Bible in to make it go. Our lives can look great but without the living Word of God in our lives we are going nowhere.

Pauline shared verse 37 which had really spoken to her; 'Jesus says All that the Father gives Me shall come to Me and the one who comes to Me I will certainly not cast out'. The team then continued to pray until Keith and Pat set out with the Word of Life to take into the village. The rest of the team continued to praise, pray, share and sup tea and coffee until it got to

12o'clock. No two sessions are alike, but hopefully it gives you a flavour of what transpires during a Micah delivery time.

Gavin believes that it is important to continue to **GO** into the community and take the Gospel to them. He is proposing to take an open air 'service' one Sunday towards the end of each month to do just that.



Prayer for the Future.

As K&P have said for some time now, it will be impossible for them to cover all of Cornwall, alone, with Bibles, and so the Lord has shown them a new way. If the local churches would invite them, they would be willing to move to an area for one month and train people in the churches to move in Acts 1:8 Evangelism, that is, 'You shall receive power to witness in the power of the Holy Spirit' as the Bibles are taken around the area, and offered to each home. It would be possible with a team of four people in each area to cover an area. That would be two delivering Bibles whilst two provide prayer support.

God's tenderness is important, and just like meat, you don't eat meat unless you cook it. Even when it is cooked it has to be right it has to be tender. Timing is important, I believe there is timing and a season coming that God is coming with salvation and is going to touch hearts of people, people who are going to a lost eternity. Time for that is coming says the Lord. He is coming by His grace and His mercy. There are many people saying that God is a just God, and God is a God of judgment, for God judges. He judges His people, He judges His church, but yet we are still in times of grace and mercy, at this time.
