Major changes in the Newsletter

As most of you know there have been changes in the way in which Micah works now. When K&P first came to Cornwall they targeted the areas the Lord had shown them before they arrived in Cornwall. By the end of March 2010 they had completed the three areas which the Lord had shown them, and that was when Pauline did her major calculation and realised that at the rate at which they were delivering Bibles it would take them 181 years to complete Cornwall.

It was around this time that the Lord led them to put together a teaching pack entitled **Acts 1:8 Evangelism**, which explained the outline of the strategy they had been using to prepare an area and take out Bibles. K&P also believed it was time for them to offer to train teams in different areas to take Bibles out into their own areas. This idea was offered out, and during 2010 two fellowships asked K&P to go along and train in their fellowships, they were Holderness Community Church in East Yorkshire and Southam Community Church in Southam, Warwick-shire. As you can see at present there has not been a church in Cornwall that has requested K&P to train there, but their heart is still to have a **Bible in every home in Cornwall**. Mind you they would not mind if there was a Bible in every home in the UK.

How does this affect the newsletter?

The day to day running of the work has changed and therefore K&P have taken some time, with Peppy, to discuss the best way to take things forward. After some discussion and thoughts banded backwards and forwards, it has been decided to produce an information newsletter quarterly, this will continue to be sent to everyone who at present receives it. K&P's real reason for sending out a newsletter is to gain regular prayer support from those who receive it, and it was for that reason the newsletter was sent on a monthly basis. K&P are very keen to see the prayer support continued, and so they are seeking to produce a monthly prayer sheet which they are only too pleased to send out to those who would like to receive it. **this will not come automatically to you; we would ask you to request to receive this. Bible Delivery in Penance

K&P have been very encouraged with the people who have come along, both to help in the Bible Delivery and Prayer support whilst the delivery is taking place. Over the six months or so that Micah have been delivering Bibles in the Treneere area of Penzance, twenty different people have come along to help with the delivery and prayer support. It was encouraging that when K&P broke for the two weeks in February that one team of two continued to take Bibles into the area. This is the way that the work will grow and more and more Bibles will be taken into the community. Praise the Lord. It is good that we still have the freedom in our land to do this, but we are ever aware that we do not know how long this will continue. Let us not be lax in doing that which the Lord has called each of us to do.

During one delivery time, Keith had a prophetic word which the prayer team then prayed into, whilst the delivery team were out. The general gist of the word was that the Lord was providing the spiritual weapons with which to defeat the enemy, and that we, His people, should arise and seek Him.

The Lord reminded us that we do not fight people, but the works of the enemy. There was a declaration that the Lord was breaking up the work of the enemy,

and there was division in the enemy's ranks. There was a crack in the dam wall, and strongholds were being pulled down.

There was a reminder that the Church will move forward when it moves united in Him. We must move in the power of the Spirit, as all that is of use is **not by power or by might, but by the work of His Spirit**. When the delivery team had gone out, the prayer team began to pray into the word and ask the Holy Spirit for guidance, what to be praying. Whilst praying about the weapons, Hazel had a picture of ivy covering a building, and she had the sense that the Lord was spreading His work over the area as we prayed. Whilst praying about unity amongst God's people, Eleanor had a picture of two partners dancing together, and she had a sense that it spoke of the work of the mission team working in with the local church in Penzance. Pauline also had the sense that the team needed to be praying concerning the crack in dam wall, that no one would be able to mend the crack, but that the wall and all it was holding together would come tumbling down, and be carried away. One time when the teams were out, there was an area which was very unreceptive, and rather than just carry on regardless, the team spent some time seeking the Lord for the reasons behind the unreceptively, and what was needed to break the area open for the Good News of Jesus. David, one of the regular prayer supporters, texted with a helpful piece of information, and the prayer team began to pray into the situation with praise and prayer. Later that morning Keith and Lynn went out to 'test' the area again and they had a good time, finding the area open and receptive. Steffan, Maureen and Pauline continued to pray as they went, and the whole team rejoiced together to see the victory in the area.



Changes in Delivery Timing

As K&P need to keep the time slots available in case anyone invites them to go and train, they now have a five week delivery period, and then a one week recovery and one week preparation time. They realise more and more how important it is to take the time with the Lord to hear from Him, and be willing to spend that time in His presence.



An Appreciation of Ron and Pauline

K&P arrived in St Just in the beginning of May 2002, and they were searching for a place to park their motor home. They went to try one site, but it was found to be unsuitable. As they had been travelling up to the first site they had noticed a site named Trevaylor which was in the hamlet of Truthwall. They returned to this site and were greeted by Pauline (the owner) and made welcome. They stayed for about three weeks on the site, and left at the end of May with the promise of returning in September. This they did receiving a warm welcome. The camp site closed

for the winter at the end of October, K&P were up country for a while in the November, and when returning to Cornwall were thrilled that Ron and Pauline were willing to let them stay on one of their fields off the campsite.

This arrangement continued until Ron and Pauline sold the campsite in March 2005, but gave K&P the invitation to stay with them at their new home whenever they needed a spot in Penwith to stay. This K&P have done from then until the end of February this year. Ron and Pauline have now realised they need a smaller home, and K&P are going to be moving on, but they wish they could express in words the appreciation they have for Ron and Pauline, and for the kindness and love they shown to K&P through the nine years they have provided a place for them to lay their wheels. They began as camp site owners, and became thoughtful and kind friends to K&P. K&P will miss the constant companionship, but have already warned Ron and Pauline that they will be visiting them at their new home, but not in Big Bertha! K&P and all the team at Micah, give thanks to God for provision of Ron and Pauline in K&P's lives, and thanks to Ron and Pauline for all they have provided for K&P and the work of Micah Mobile Ministries. We wish them many years of happy retirement and blessings in their new home for them and their family.

One week they arrived and Keith shared that he had

the words Salvation and Intimacy, these were written onto the piece of paper at front of the church. Keith then added Repentance under these words. He asked Pauline to write prayer in the centre of these words. She thought for a moment and realised that it is so easy for us as human beings to see prayer as the formula by which we 'twist God's arm'. She realised that prayer is not the answer, God is, and so she wrote, Hear the Father, talk to the Father, do what the Father says. She added There is no formula - only Him. Under which Keith wrote neither by might, nor by power But by My Spirit says the Lord. Some time was then spent praying into these areas and seeking to hear what the Holy Spirit was saying concerning these things.

As the day continued Keith listed some of the areas which are destroying our nation

Micah Mobile Ministries in Southam

Keith and Pauline have visited Southam Community Church on several occasions previously, but in October this year they came to work alongside the church in a specific way for a period of almost five weeks. The primary purpose of the work was to provide the best opportunity for all to hear the gospel and to engage the Southam community with the good news of Jesus Christ through the distribution of Bibles into homes and to share testimony of the life-transforming message of Jesus with all. Keith and Pauline believed that the Lord had directed them to a particular area of the town in which the harvest was ripe for the Lord's purpose and the town and the area were prepared in prayer as we

sought to the Lord together. The goodness and mercy of God never ceases to amaze, and we found incredible favour as we began to knock on doors and were met with hospitality and a willingness to hear what the Lord had to say. Bibles and testimonies were gratefully received, prayer was welcomed, and many honestly shared with us the challenges and questions of their lives as we directed them to the Lord for an answer. Many within the fellowship took up the challenge to faithfully intercede in prayer and praise while others began to do the work of an evangelist and found great encouragement and blessing as they shared the good news of the Saviour of the world with all those who had ears to hear. Many of those who were involved in the work will continue with it throughout the town and we are believing for more to join us in this ministry of reconciliation which the Lord has entrusted to us. We thank God for Keith and Pauline and their willingness to share the good news of Jesus in a pro-active and compassionate way. We thank God for their passion for the gospel and for their courageous unwillingness to let the offensive truth of the unique and supreme Christ be ignored in our increasingly pluralistic society.

Keith and Pauline Horobin of Micah Mobile Ministries worked with Southam Community Church between the 3rd of October and the 5th of December, 2010.

Over the five week period that Keith and Pauline worked with the church about ten people were trained and accompanied Keith on the doors. Over 110 bibles were distributed and many more tracts were given out. Five people within the church produced their testimonies for distribution.

Since Keith and Pauline's departure, the same strategy has continued to produce encouraging results. This vision allows the church to look outwards and to use its energy in seeking to do something really worthwhile – as Keith and Pauline say, people never throw a Bible away; they usually put it on a shelf, as Helga did with the one Keith gave her some time before she started seeking the Lord.



An Article written on Face Book by Mike Hubbard an Elder at Holderness Community Church

2010 was a significant year in many ways. For me the outstanding feature was the vision imparted to the church by Keith and Pauline's visit in May/June, to place Bibles in people's homes throughout Holderness. Bible distribution is what the Lord has led them to do in Cornwall – producing some fruit that is immediate and other fruit that they believe will come from these 'unexploded bombs' in the future. What was so helpful about their visit was that they not only spoke about the project but showed us how to go about it, training us over a period of 4 weeks. They met with those who were available on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9 am – 3 p.m. and also put on extra sessions in an evening for those working in the daytime. They stressed the importance of worship; when some of us arrived on the first Tuesday just after 9 o'clock, we found them already singing, thanking and praising the Lord. When we tried to beat the 9 o'clock starting point on the Thursday it was still the same. What a lesson! They had discovered that it's important to come fully focused on the business of the day, so they deliberately leave no room for general chit-chat at the start of the day: attention is immediately devoted entirely to the Lord. After a prolonged time of praise and worship and of submitting ourselves afresh to the Lord, we are much more likely to hear the Lord's direction. Keith and Pauline have learned the importance of 'ploughing', of preparing in the spiritual realm the area to be visited with the Bibles. So they led us in spiritual walks, telling us to keep our physical and spiritual eyes open for any indications of the spiritual atmosphere in the places we'd be operating in. Once returned to base we shared our experiences - positive and negative – and wrote down on a large sheet our findings. Then it was a case of coming up with Biblical texts that could be planted in

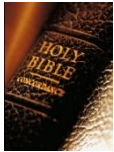
