

Back from Africa

We are grateful for all the folks who have prayed for us during our time in the Democratic Republic of Congo. As so many of you have prayed for us; we wanted to share with you some of the experiences we have had.

We spent just under two weeks in the Congo and it was an experience that no amount of explaining would have given us understanding of what we would see, hear, smell and experience. Africa is a world all of its own, and one which it is easy to fall in love with.

The welcome we received from the Christians, both in Kinshasa (the capital and place of our landing), and Kananga (the town we stayed in for the majority of our visit) was warm and overwhelming with the honour and respect they showed us.

The trip also gave opportunity for Keith to share with Pastor Willy in Kananga, and Pastor James in Kinshasa concerning the Acts 1:8 Evangelism Training Manual.

They both seemed to see a potential use for the Manual in their respective churches and church networks, and we are thrilled to see that the work of Micah Mobile Ministries is now indeed going global. To be effective in the Congo the Manual will need to be translated into French and that is yet another aspect of needs in the work.

We are thrilled to have a copy of the manual translated for us into Swahili and a second pastor in Kenya is looking into using it in this translation.

Keith, Pauline and Nigel were privileged to preach in the church during their time there. Keith and Nigel's message being translated into French by Pastor Willy, and Pauline's message, to the ladies, being translated into Tshiluba by a young lady translator.
