MMM the future!?!

MMM is the product of God calling K&P to evangelise in Cornwall. The Lord specified the three County Parishes which were St Just in Penwith, Hayle and St Teath. However at that time He did not specify Bibles.

K&P were concerned about accountability while in Cornwall and mentioned this to Steve and Jenny Watson. They suggested setting up a Charitable Trust, and offered to help in any way they could including taking on the role of Trustees. David and Lynda Lush and Margaret and Martin Senior were also approached to take on the role of Trustees and they accepted. As time went by Steve and Jenny became more and more involved in the way the Lord was leading them, and consequently they resigned, and Tony and Margaret Brown volunteered to take their place.

May 2002, K&P set off from David and Lynda's home in Hayle to find somewhere to park their van in St Just, and the rest is history (if you are interested the story is told in greater detail in the book 'Shared Lives' available at the end of the year). In the September of 2002 whilst sitting in a car park facing a row of houses, Keith heard the Lord say to offer each house a Bible'. This rang so true to both of them, and door to door Bible delivery by *MMM* in Cornwall began.

Both K&P listen to Derek Prince's tapes, and Pauline remembered Derek stating on a number of occasions that if your vision is able to be fulfilled by you alone it is not from God! God's visions need God's hand to fulfill them. From September 2002 K&P knew their vision, from God, was **TO OFFER A BIBLE IN EVERY HOME IN CORNWALL.** The well known proverb states that the journey of 1,000 miles starts with the first step. The first step to fulfilling this vision was St Just. By March 2010 every home in St Just, Hayle and St Teath, a total of 6,500 properties, were visited; of which approx 66% in St Just, 70% in Hayle and 76% in St Teath received **Bibles** and testimony tracts, **with an opportunity to hear the good news of Jesus.**

Having completed the original mandate Pauline worked out it would take them **181 years** to offer a Bible to every home in Cornwall, so they sought the Lord for a new strategy to complete the vision. In October 2009 they toured some areas of the country with a presentation entitled Ploughing, Sowing and Reaping, based on Isaiah 28:23-29. With this presentation K&P were able to share what the Lord had taught them about Bible Delivery, and sharing Jesus with every home in a community. *MMM's* original statement was a phrase borrowed from Summer Crusades Charity **to reach people where they are.** Pauline believes the

statement to add to that one in respect of door to door 'Bible Delivery' is, **To give opportunity for everyone in the community to hear the Good News of Jesus** After the tour they realised the possibilities of using the 'Ploughing, Sowing and Reaping' presentation as a way of showing what MMM does to churches or individual Christians, who were interested in reaching their local communities with the good news of Jesus, in a systematic way.

They realised that to see the whole of Cornwall reached with a Bible it was necessary to get local Churches and Christians 'on board'. If K&P took a month in an area to train a minimum of four interested people in the way the Lord had shown them, then those Churches or Christians could deliver Bibles in their own area... In this way the whole of Cornwall could be covered.

K&P, therefore, set to work producing a power point presentation with training manual entitled **ACTS 1:8 EVANGELISM.**

Holderness Community Church in Yorkshire were the first to come forward to be trained. This should take place from May 22nd to June 24th. In essence HCC are going to be guinea pigs for this training programme, and K&P hope to 'iron out' any wrinkles as they share with 'old friends'. K&P are very much looking forward to training in this way. After this the Pastor and elders of Southam Community Church have invited them to spend the month of October doing the same. Those who have a knowledge of geography (this will not include Peppy says Pauline) will realise neither of these locations are in Cornwall, (I know that!!!!) but K&P feel that if that is where God wants them in the interim that is fine. K&P have been approached by Wendy Cashmore in East Taphouse to do the same, but a date has not been fixed yet. They are also in discussion with Light and Life Church in Penzance with a view of taking Bibles in Penzance; Keith in particular would like to see Bibles being delivered here. They will be contacting all the churches in Penzance to see if anybody else is interested, and wanting to take up the challenge of delivering Bibles in the town.

The way forward in this ministry is to see local Churches and Christians doing what a K&P have been doing for the last eight years. K&P (initially) are available to enter into discussions with any ministers or groups of local Christians who would be interested in entering into a month's training, and then taking Bibles into their own area. It would require a minimum of 4 people to start; that is two to pray and two to deliver. If anyone reading the newsletter is interested please contact either by phone, e-mail or letter that is in Cornwall, the UK or further afield.

If you want to get more involved in working with *M.M.M.*, but are unable, at this time, to take a physically active role there is always prayer. Prayer support for *M.M.M.*, occurs on many different levels. There are all of you who have this newsletter who pray at least once a month as you are reading through, and asking the Lord to care for the work and the workers. There are prayer groups or individuals who add *M.M.M.* to their regular prayer times. There are groups like the one in Aldbrough at Martin and Margaret's home, and Hayle at David and Lynda's home who meet each week. They receive regular updates by phone, and they 'feedback' anything specific that the Lord has shown them which *M.M.M.* need to know. Finally there are people who have committed to pray as and when needed, and are contacted by text whenever a particular need becomes apparent, and each time the Bible Delivery teams go out on the doors. Easter Saturday afternoon saw a good number of folks gather at the Poldark Inn, where Pat had arranged and invited many people to come and share a 'free cup of tea and a bun' It was certainly an excellent spread, and was enjoyed by all who gathered. It was good to have one of the ladies with whom Pauline has been doing Bible studies come along, and many folks from different 'church' backgrounds join together and share a meal.

Easter Sunday was special, K&P set off early in the morning to St Breward to take their last service on the Tintagel and Camelford Circuit. Linda, kindly made Pauline an Easter hat which Pauline had promised to wear on Sunday morning. As Keith's sermon was entitled, 'The head that once was crowned with thorns is crowned with glory now'; it appeared to have some significance. Keith's sermon was powerful, anointed and appreciated by the people. K&P went on from there to meet with the folks from Church in the House at their Celebration Meeting. It was joyful and encouraging time with a challenge from the preacher

Don Double concerning baptism, of which a number of people responded, and asked to be baptised.

Last but certainly not least K&P went along to the open air meeting outside the Spar shop in Delabole. 18 Christians gathered to sing Easter praises to Jesus. The folks in the shop kindly supplied the singers with tea, pasties and hot cross buns all of which were appreciated. Pauline shared about the resurrection, and passers by were left in no doubt that there were Christians who were alive and well in Delabole.
